# **ALMOST READY WITH NEW FRANCHISE ACT**

Judge D. F. McWatt Succumbs to War Times Elections Act Is in Bad Repute.

[Special to The Advertiser.]

Objectionable Features.

In the matter of qualifications, many of the objectionable features of the war-times elections act will be abolished, and the provisions of the by-elections act will be adopted. As a matter of fact the right to vote depends primarily on citizenship, and under the amended naturalization act it is in the power of the secretary of state to refuse or grant naturalization as well as to deprive any individual already naturalized of his citizenship for the cause. Under the by-elections act personal

Under the by-elections act personal naturalization is required. That is to say, an alien could not qualify for the federal franchise through marriage with a British subject or through the naturalization of a parent. This reservation, however did not apply to persons born on the North American Continent. Under the by-elections act, moreover, provision was made whereby a woman, otherwise qualified, who had lost her citizenship through marriage with an alien could secure the franchise.

Publish Sources. A further provision of the new act, t is rumored, will be a requirement the sources of campaign funds be made public. made public.

Strong pressure is being brought to bear to have the principle of proportional representation applied in future federal elections and the calling of a "speakers' conference" has been mooted. Whether the principle is applied or not, it is fully believed that he next redistribution will increase the representation of urban centres.

## **BRITISH PARLIAMENT** REJECTS MOTION TO **REVISE PEACE PACT**

Criticized by Laborites.

LONDON, Feb. 12.—Most of today's session of the House of Commons was occupied in a discussion of the motion of William James Thorne, labor member for Westham, in favor of a revision of the peace treaty, which he subjected to severe criticism. The most interesting suggestion emalated from Lord Robert Cecil, that the league of nations should send two international commissioners to Russia to ascertain the exact conditions and to fix the provisional boundaries of the border states.

Arthur J. Balfour, lord president of the council, who made a general defence of the treaty and the Government's share therein, said he feared Lord Robert's suggestion would not result in a new heaven on earth in Russia. He also denied that the Government was encouraging Poland in a policy of adventure.

Motion is Rejected.

The motion of William Thorne was rejected, 254 to 60.

LAST WEEK SHOWED EMPLOYMENT GROWTH

OTTAWA, Feb. 12.—A steady increase in the volume of employment in Canada is shown in reports of 4.639 firms to the department of labor during January. These employers reported to the employment service of Canada a total of 668,991 persons on their payrolls for the week, ending January 24, which represents an increase of one per cent over the preceding week. Increases in staffs are reported by all classes of industry except a few in which no increase could be expected at this time, and the steady increase appears to be general throughout the country, being most marked in the province of Quebec.


