RATEPAYERS MUST

ASSUME THEIR SHARE

Council Will Not Pay For 25

Per Cent of Woodman

Avenue Extension.

The recommendation of No. 2 committee that the city assume 25 per cent of the total cost of extending Woodman avenue, was rejected at last night's meeting of the city council. The work will now proceed on a first arrangement, with the ratepayers shouldering their proportion of the cost with the city. The taxpayers of the district affected asked for relief from the cost, claiming that the increased taxation would incur a great hardship on many in that locality.

Ald. Ashton was of the opinion last night, in reply to Ald. Harley's query as to who would be benefited by the 25 per cent, that the city would be gaining in the long run. Ald. Wenige's motion to have the recommendation sent back to the committee was defeated, the mayor pointing out that on the 18th of this month, and a decision must be made at once.

LONDON TO HAVE

JAP VICE-CONSUL

Y. Sati Appointed, According

to Information Received.

According to an announcement made in the weekly bulletin of the commercial and intelligence service of the department of trade and commerce in Ottawa, issued on June 6, a Japanese vice-consul is to be named in London.

This information came as a complete surprise to the local Chamber of Commerce, and to all city officials, who were absolutely unaware that any such office was contemplated in this city.

The name of the vice-consul was given as Y. Sati. Other than that, and the fact that the announcement was unexpectantly made in a list of additional consuls to be stationed in London, the local officials have no further information on the subject. Up to the present time, so far as it is known, Mr. Sati has not arrived in the city.

The office of the vice-consul of Commerce are awaiting further word before any action is taken, fearing that some mistake has been made. Although there are but few Japanese in this city, the appointment of such an office is welcomed, for it is believed that Mr. Sati will be of valuable assistance in promoting trade between the firms of this city and Japan.

RECONSIDER NAME

OF NEW COLLEGIATE

No. 2 Committee Thinks "Central

High School" a Better

Designation.

What is the difference, if any, between a high school and a collegiate institute, and what effect, if any, would either name have relative to the standard of the school?

Trustee A. A. Langford intimated at yesterday's meeting of No. 2 committee of the board of education that he was not quite sure on this point, and accordingly was out after enlightenment.

In a moment of thoughtlessness we passed on the name "Great War Memorial High School," and I believe that if the name Collegiate Institute is the right name, that now is the time to have the change made.

Principal Mooney volunteered the information that the standard collegiate institute, as recognized by the authorities, called for at least five teachers who are specialists in at least one particular subject. "Personally," he asserted, "I am in favor of leaving the present name. Of course, as we meet the requirements, we have a high school, but we also have a high school. You are nominally wrong, of course, but the name high school will certainly fail to lower the standard of the institution."
