SALARY LIST FROM P.U.C. NOT RECEIVED BY CLERK

Baker Reports To Finance Committee of Failure To Answer Letter.

REPEAT REQUEST

To Investigate Report of Police Receiving Witness Fees in Court.

The city clerk reported to the finance committee yesterday that he had received no reply from the public utilities commission to his letter of some weeks back asking for its salary list. The list from Victoria Hospital had been sent on. He was instructed to get in touch with the commission and repeat his request.

"The commission can write often when it wants something like a registry office," remarked Alderman Anderson, "why can't it answer our letter asking for the salary list?"

The finance committee decided to ask the police commission whether constables on the force receive witness fees. Alderman Smith told the committee that he thought there was a recent enactment by the Provincial Legislature preventing it. The police commission financial statement reported to the committee shows several constables were paid a witness fee for attendance at police court.

Granted Leave. Relief Inspector McCallum was granted another month's leave of absence until July 11, on the recommendation of Chairman Douglas.

Printing tenders were let to the Knowles Printing Company for the voters' lists, and to the Hollands Press for the mayor's and the city clerk's envelopes. These being the lowest tenders, they were accepted conditional on compliance with the bylaw which necessitates the payment of union wages to the help employed.

The tender of Terry's Garage for the motorization of the ladder truck at the east end fire hall for \$3,100 was accepted by the committee. This tender includes a two year guarantee on material and one year on service.

Smith To Re-present. Alderman Smith was named to represent the city at the United Empire Loyalists gathering in Belleville on Tuesday of next week. The consideration of the Britain report on the fire department and the committee's recommendations to the council were deferred to the next meeting.

Building Inspector Piper brought in an estimate for the alterations to the central fire hall, for \$7,000, which was considered high, and was filed for future reference.

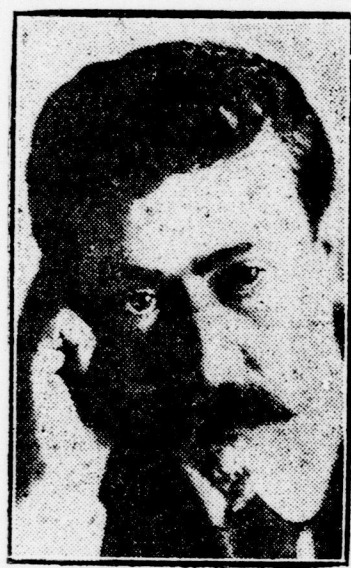
On the matter of the franchise bylaw, which the aldermen undertook to "read, mark, learn and inwardly digest" some time ago, the committee reported progress, and asked for an indefinite extension of time to get further orientation with its peculiarities.

The full power and authority of the committee was assured to George Tustin, inspector of the Humane Society, in the prosecution of his duty and several citizens who are not living up to the bylaw in respect to stray dogs.

Heat Estimate. The Helena Costume Company, which supplies heat to the central fire hall, sent in an estimate of \$89.74 for the coming winter. It was explained that the turning off of the heat at night last winter was the result of a misunderstanding on the part of the engineer.

A delegation from the Woodman avenue residents asking the committee to remove the local improvement tax from their property, a matter of \$1.44 a foot for ten years, and which they knew nothing of at the time of purchase. The committee decided to view the lots in question before going further.

Dr. Holme appeared, asking that the lane at the back of his property on Queen's avenue might be taken over by the city, as the owners were

willing to donate it, so that it might be properly taken care of. He stipulated only that the ground should be maintained as a public thoroughfare permanently by the city.

A request from the board of education for the issue of debentures to the extent of \$39,000 for the erection of a west end addition to the Technical School, which was approved by the council last year, was agreed to and recommended to the council.
