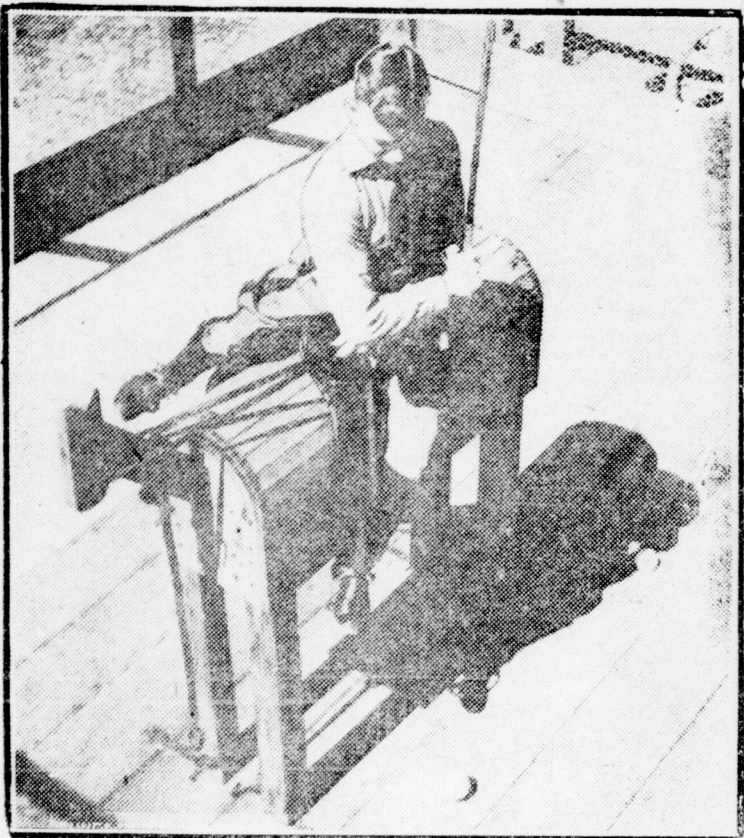


Seeks Big Income; Hod Carrier for Olympic; Takes to Monocle

Above photograph shows an ostrich being shorn of its fine plumes on an ostrich farm at South Africa while an American bluejacket looks on



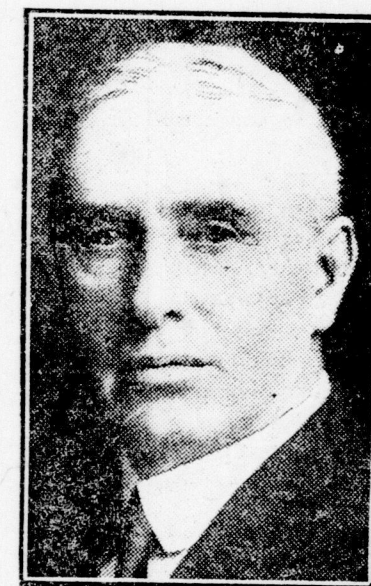
Frank McCaroli (left) and "Skeeton Bill" (right) two of the rodeo boys photographed in London. Bill is giving Frank a little "info" about the old land



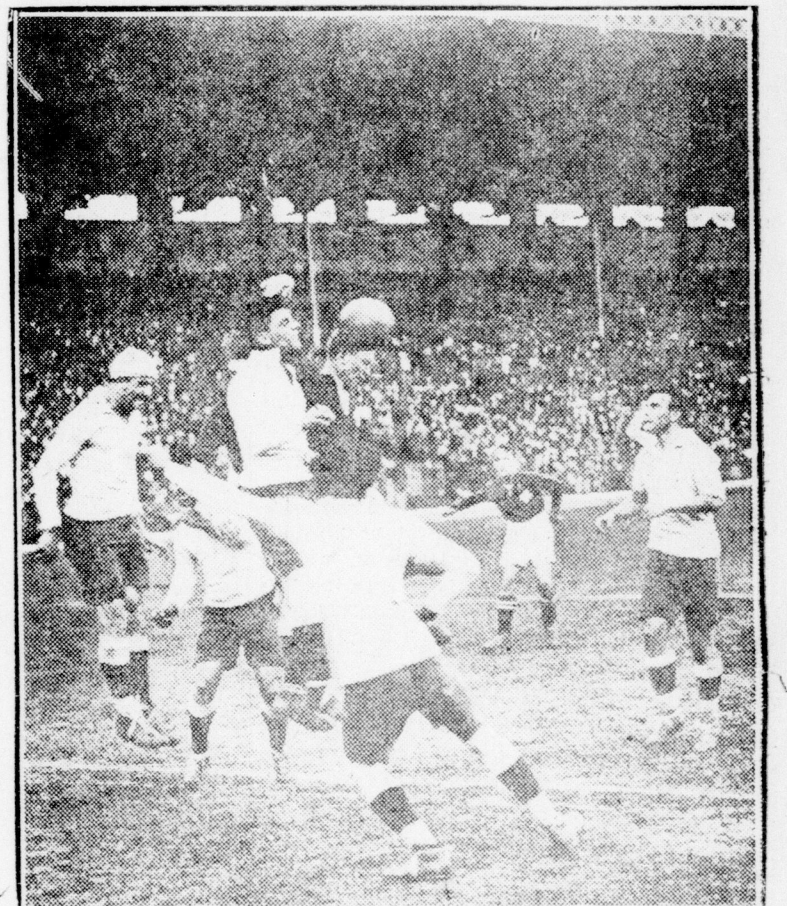

London musical critics are loud in their praise of the young lady shown above, who is Miss Mary Lewis, a Follies girl, and who recently made her first appearance in London



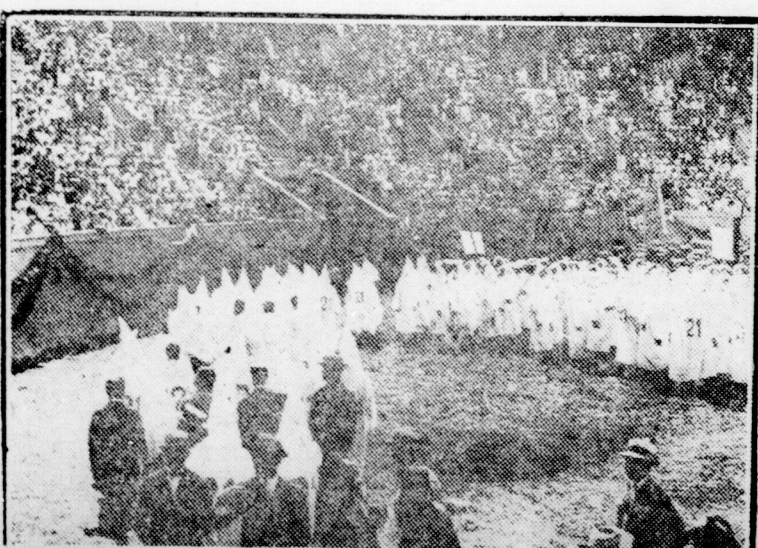
A photograph of the wife and children of William G. McAdoo, favorite for the Democratic presidential nomination in the U.S.

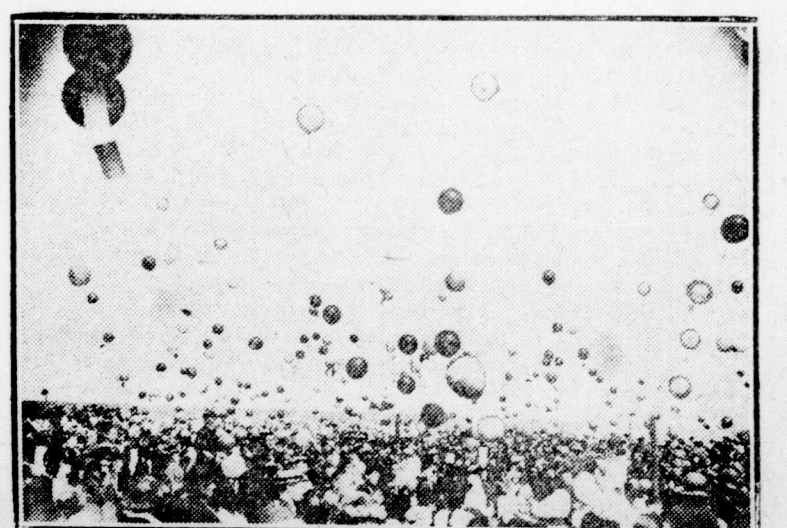
