WIPED OUT THE DEBT. Subscriptions to Association Hall indebtedness Reached the \$50,000 Mark. The canvass for subscriptions to the Y. M. C. A. Hall debt closed yesterday. The undertaking when the canvass was begun two months ago to wipe out the total indebtedness to Association Hall has been accomplished, and there is great rejoicing among the friends of the institution. Two weeks ago a prominent philanthropic citizen subscribed \$5,000 on the understanding that the subscription should hold good only in the event of the total amount being secured by July 1. As a result, special effort was made. A condition was that they should become void unless the whole debt was subscribed for. By completing the work yesterday, all subscriptions will therefore hold good. All parties having received subscriptions are requested to return the same liberally filled in, as in the case of many of the subscriptions payment is spread over three years, and an extra amount will be required for interest until the debt is paid.
