USE AND VALUE OF MARI.
Mari is of such agricultural importance that Dr. F. T. Shutt, the Deminion Chemist, in his last annual report says that he feels warranted in again calling attention to its value as a cheap and excellent amendment for soils in need of lime. As yet farmers in Canada have not, he considers, fully realized its worth. In many districts marl is procurable at a minimum of expense, soesibly at the cest of digring sud hading making to by far the cheapest form of lime for agricultural purposes. Mari usually occurs in beds of a few inches to several feet in thickness on old lake bottoms, frequently overlaid by awang muck or peaty deposit. Some fifty samples were sent in to be examined at the Dominion Experimental Farms laboratory at Ottawa during the year with which the report deals and the results of the analyses are all given.
