BRUSSELS, Ont., Oct. 30 .- George Thompson, grocer, a leading business man of Brussels for more than 40 years, died suddenly this evening while seated at the supper table. He had been at his store all day and appeared in his sual health.

The late Mr. Thompson was about 55 years of age. He served for several years in the Town Council and was a member of the Presbyterian church. Besides his widow, he is survived by two sons and three daugh-ters: George, in Toronto; James, in California; Mrs. Charles Dodds, of British Columbia; Mrs. Garfield Long, of Niagara Falls, and Mrs. Cleve Baker, f this town. Funeral arrangements have not been nnounced.
