☞ All stamps for sale by me at the time of going to press are quoted in this paper.

☞ To economise space, many stamps are grouped in sets, but any stamp will be SOLD SEPARATELY if desired.

☞ All stamps sold by me are guaranteed to be genuine originals and in good condition. I DO NOT SELL REPRINTS.

☞ Orders under 25 cents are respectfully declined.

☞ All orders will be filled, as far as possible, on the day of receipt.

☞ Stamps not perfectly satisfactory may be returned within 30 days, and money will be refunded.

☞ PRICES ARE NET, and are subject to change without notice. My average prices are THE LOWEST IN THE MARKET. Postage is extra on orders under \$1.00. With orders over \$2.00, 5 cents extra for registration should be sent, as I cannot hold myself responsible for letters or parcels lost in the mails, coming or going.

☞ REMITTANCES of \$2.00 or over should be made by Postal Note, Post Office or Express Money Order, Draft on London or New York, or Bank Notes at current rates of exchange.

☞ Small amounts under \$2.00 may be remitted in current unused stamps of any country. Stamps should be well centred; and of as many different values as possible, not more than 25 of one sort.

☞ Although all stamps quoted by me in each number of this paper are in stock at the time that number is issued, it is well for correspondents to provide against certain stamps being sold out by sending a supplementary want list with every order. I never substitute, but return with stamps ordered any balance remaining, unless otherwise instructed.

☞ **New Issues.**—Correspondents in the British and American Colonies, and in Asia, Africa, South America and Oceania, are requested to send me stamps, to the amount of \$2.00 to \$5.00, of any NEW or PROVISIONAL ISSUES which may appear in their country, and I will remit the amount by return mail, with cost of postage, and from 20% to 50% premium according to the scarcity of stamps sent.

☞ Letters asking for information should always contain stamps for reply. I take no notice of postcards, except Postal Union reply cards, complete.

☞ Correspondents will oblige by giving full name and address with every communication.

☞ The above general notices should be carefully preserved, as they will not be repeated in full in the next two issues of this paper.
