THEIR DEMOURN WAS FIRM AND RESOLVED; they walked up the steps to the gallows where their earthly existence was so soon to terminate, without the slightest assistance, and were immediately engaged with their reverend attendants in religious exercises. Hazelton and Jones, being of the Roman Catholic persuasion, were accompanied by the Rev. Fathers O'Brien, Conolly, and Quinn.

HE THEN came forward and addressed the audience in a few words; he said he was a native of Ireland, and advised all his countrymen to take warning from his fate. He acknowledged the justice of his sentence, and that he was sorry from his heart for the transactions in which he had been a participant.
