The Collegiate Course of the Faculty of Medicine of McGill University begins, in 1896, on Tuesday, September 22nd, and will continue until the beginning of June, 1897.

The Primary subjects are taught, as far as possible, practically by individual instruction in the laboratories, and the final work by clinical instruction in the wads of the hospitals. Based on the Edinburgh model the instruction is chiefly bedside, and the student personally investigates and reports the cases under the supervision of the professors of Clinical Medicine and Clinical Surgery. Each student is required for his degree to have noted as Clinical Clerk in the Medical and Surgical wards for a period of six months each, and to have presented reports acceptable to the Professors on at least ten cases in Medicine and ten in Surgery.

About \$100,000 have been expended during the last two years in extending the Universit, buildings and laboratories and equipping the different departments for practical work.

The Faculty provides a Reading-Room for Students in connection with the Medical Library which contains over 15,000 volumes.

MATRICULATION.—The Matriculation Examinations for entrance to Arts and Medicine are held in The entrance examinations of the various Canadian Medical Boards are ac epted.

COURSES.—A Double Course for the Degree at M.D.C.M. is four sessions of about nine months each. Advanced Courses are given to graduates and others desiring to pursue special or research work in the laboratories of the University and in the Clinical and Pathological laboratories of the Royal Victoria and Montreal General Hospitals

A Post-Graduate Course is given for Practitioners during May and June of each year. This course consists of daily lectures and clinics as well as demonstrations in the recent advances in Medicine and Surgery and laboratory courses in Clinical Bacteriology, Clinical Chemistry and Microscopy.

Hospitals.—The Royal Victoria, the Montreal General Hospital, and the Montreal Maternity Hospital are attlized for purposes of Clinical instruction. The physicians and surgeons connected with these are the Clinical Professors of the University.

These two general hospitals have a capacity of 250 heds each, and upwards of 30,000 patients received treatment in the out-door department of the Montreal General Hospital alone last year.
