Since January 11, 1967, the government has had a motion on the order paper for the establishment of a special committee on procedure. We were told at ten o'clock this evening that if the house moves expeditiously tomorrow, that item of business may be called.

The government hopes that it will pass tomorrow. That motion will give a special committee wide power to recommend procedural improvements to the house; and I am sure the committee would not want to overlook the arguments in favour of electronic voting machines, even though I suspect that such machines would not work a very great improvement in time saving in this chamber.

Motion agreed to and the house adjourned at 10.18 p.m.
