1876 Inquiry by the Honorable Mr. *Dever* :—

February 14—Whether any immediate action will be taken by the Government in carrying to completion that portion of Railway, at *St. John, N. B.*, known as the *Courtney Bay* Railway extension, which is now in a most unpleasant state of apparent abandonment, notwithstanding the large amount of public money expended thereon, and the great desire manifested by merchants and others for a deep-water terminus at that Port?
