

The Japanese also came over from Troas and settled first near the Massians and moved eastward with them as far as Apian Campus. Thibetans also came into this neighborhood. Some Turks may have gone south of Adramyttium.

The Finns after them Hungarians and Gauls moved steadily northward between the Latin and the Lithuanian districts. Many small unknown tribes came in now; for it was expected that the former inhabitants would move out, as the Morros invaded the west coast.

The application of record words should be carefully determined, not be read off the reel. The Russians have two words for morning: etro and rano. They come from different places. Etro people were east of them northeast of the Latins. But the Russians moved to the Duse district and then to the north side of the Lithuanians. Here Irish, Arans or "Rano" were east.

We find very few Makes, relatives of the Rams. They and the Madas used the western Amic dialect. It appears that the Makes to a great extent settled in Syria near the bend of the Orontes. North of Imma was the Amyca plain. There was a town called "Onchae" by the Greeks - should have been Omichae or Omychae. The inhabitants now call it Umk. The district must have reached into the Amok valley between the Amanus ranges. The Magi, no doubt, lived here at an early time.
