1672-82.—Governorship of Frontenac, who built the first walls, defeated both British and Indians, and upheld the authority of his office against all rivals.

1659-1706.—Great Episcopate of the first Bishop of Quebec, Monseigneur de Montmorency-Laval.

1755-59.—Complete corruption under Vaudreuil and Bigot.

1759.—Montcalm, Saunders and Wolfe.

1760.—Murray and Lévis.

1763.—100 years after the constitution of New France as a Royal Province it is ceded to the British Crown, by the Treaty of Paris, on the 10th of February.
