FRENCH RAILWAYS BAFFLE GERMANS

Berlin Writer Also Blames Rich Reserves for Latest Check.

Amsterdam, June 6.—The Berlin Vossische Zeitung's military correspondent in an article on the offensive on the western front says: "It should be emphasized repeatedly, in view of exaggerated hopes, that a decision can be procured only comparatively slowly. The foe is enabled to organize his resistance owing to his brilliantly constructed railway system, which has junctions and unloading stations at Comples and Villers Cotterets. The German supreme command cannot well proceed now against the newly consolidated French front, which is richly provided with reserves, and bear the great losses which experience shows are entailed by such operations. When the French brought up big reserves movement was to a certain extent change will shortly occur in the entire system of battle operations. The battle can only proceed slowly; a decisive battle cannot be procured in a few days. We should therefore arm ourselves anew with patience. The continuation of the big offensive will again mean a surprise for our enemies."
