GOLD BENEATH ONTARIO. An interesting letter received from Prof. Coleman by Mr. Blue of the Bureau of Mines.

Prof. A. P. Coleman of the School of Practical Science is at present in the Ontario mining regions, as the agent of the Provincial Government, writes Mr. Blue of the Bureau of Mines of what he has seen.

He states that very rich but rather refractory ore has been taken out of the Mikado mine which was sold the other day for \$50,000. The deposit has turned out to be wider than was supposed last year, but only one well is defined, and there is some doubt about the extent of the vein to the south. Some of the gold-lode specimens from the Mikado are very pretty.

After all, Mr. Coleman goes on, "there is nothing I have seen to be compared with our friend Caldwell's Sullivan. I went all over it and was astonished and delighted with what I saw. It is an immense body of quartz, the quantity now sighted alone representing a fortune.

"The ore at the lower levels is turning out well out of the blis of quartz, I picked up myself at Rondeau nearly 300 feet below the surface, two showed little nuggets of gold. First one of the veins is in sight alone representing a fortune.

Prof. Coleman is expected home in about two weeks and an account of his trip will appear in the Annual report of the Bureau of Mines, shortly to be issued.
