

WILL NOT DECREASE THE RATIO OF JOURNEMENTS TO APPRENTICES TO PLEASE MANUFACTURERS.

TIME MIGHT FIND MANY MEN IDE... Skilled Mechanics Looking Far Ahead of the Present Wave of Prosperity.

The Iron Moulders have finally found a question that is causing the delegates all kinds of trouble to settle. In fact it promises to develop something of a deadlock in spite of the astuteness and clear-headed business sagacity of most of those composing the delegation.

As a result of this conference, the committee of moulders presented two reports to the convention yesterday. The committee was divided. The majority report changed the ratio of one to eight, as at present established, to one to six. The minority suggested a ratio of one to seven.

The convention rejected the majority report after a prolonged debate, and the first thing to-day the minority report will come up for discussion. The indications are that even this concession will not be granted and that the moulders will insist upon the ratio remaining as at present.

The Iron Moulders take the position, as a majority, that the ratio of supply and demand of journeymen moulders is being disturbed every year, and that if more apprentices are not put to work as desired by the manufacturers, it will be but a short time until there will be such an overproduction of moulders that labor disbursements incident to an excess of supply over demand will be inevitable.

The convention leaders assert that trouble is inevitable if the ratio is not more apprentices to be given employment. They declare that they are capable of producing more moulders than the manufacturers want and that there is a real danger of overproduction.

From statements of leading members of the convention, it looks as if the ratio will be insisted upon by the moulders. When the manufacturers' committee was in Toronto last week, the members said the ratio must be changed so as to give them more apprentices. Now, just how strong this "must" is with the owners of big factories is to be determined later.

While it is altogether improbable that a strike will result from the failure of the moulders to accept a change in the apprentice ratio, it is possible that a serious labor disturbance may follow the failure of the convention to settle this question to the satisfaction of the Stove Foundry National Defence Association.

CAUSED RUN ON THE VAULTS

Depositors Feared That Their Values Were Lost... Chicago, July 21.—News of the disappearance of nearly \$30,000, belonging to racing men, from the vaults of the Masonic Temple Safety Deposit Company last Saturday, had spread to such an extent to-day that it caused a "run" on the vaults.

When business began today there was a throng of men and women depositors in waiting, who feared for money and valuables that they had deposited in the company's strong boxes. For a time the company's office force could not cope with the demand for verification of signatures, and in the vaults the turnkeys were unable to open boxes fast enough to keep down the crowd.
