Synopsis of Canadian North. west Land Regulations

The sole head of a family, or any many ver 18 years old, may homestead a quarer-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions. Duties .- Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions, A habitable house is required, except where esidence is performed in the vicinity. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

In certain districts a homesteader in good

standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price, \$3.00 per Duties.—Six months' residence in each o Duties.—Six months' residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres' extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.
