

CONNAUGHT PARK JOCKEY CLUB LOSES CUSTODY OF LITTLE BOY

RAIN INTERFERES AT NORTH RANDALL

Now Necessary to Crowd

Cleveland, July 8.—After the first race, a dash for the three-year-old trotters, had been raced at the Grand Randall today, a heavy rain set in, flooding the track to such an extent that the balance of the Grand Circuit program was postponed until tomorrow.
