ONTARIO LAND SURVEYORS.

Annual Banquet Held at McConkey's Last Evening.

The Ontario Land Surveyors' Association continued its thirteenth annual meeting at the parliament buildings yesterday. Several reports were presented. George R. Kirkpatrick read the report to the board of examiners. C. A. Jones gave a report of the council and M. G. Givler reported on land surveying in which he said the profession has found ample work during the year. The report on engineering contracts making curve ranging a feature in examination papers. It calls attention to the necessity of devising some plan by means of which the unrighteous and lack of continuity in city streets could be avoided. The obliteration of old surveying monuments and corner stakes in cities and the question of best position for sewers, gas, telephone and other conduits was emphasized. They hoped the activity in railway construction would not attract too many surveyors to enter the profession. J. F. Whitson gave a paper on "The Personal Supervision of Surveys" in which he pointed out the difficulty in compiling mining location surveys on account of unqualified assistants being engaged in the mining boom of 1897. The instructions from the crown lands department demand that surveys shall be made under the personal supervision of a qualified land surveyor. Certificates to this effect must be attached to railway plans, but it is not the custom for surveyors to attach certificates. It is alleged that surveyors entrust work to apprentices, and in some instances surveys have not visited the locality themselves. He suggested, as the public pays for the services of competent commissioned surveyors, that surveyors attesting their accounts should be made to swear that they were personally engaged in the work. On account of erroneous surveys, parties have lost their farms in litigation; much money has been spent in re-surveying old townships. Following this paper, a resolution was passed requesting the committee on legislation to ascertain the status of articles published in hand surveys, and to investigate the means of their expression, "personal supervision" used in certificates for crown land and other surveys. A method of discipline for those departing from the intent of the expression, "personal supervision," is also to be laid down. Other papers read were: "The Status of Ontario Land Surveyors," by P. S. Gibson, in which he said that in no other country were surveyors recognized by the government, and a paper by Mr. Stewart on "Statistical Topographic Surveying."

In the evening the annual banquet was held at McConkey's restaurant.

Will Go Back to Basis of 1903—Nominees for West York License Commissioners.

Toronto Junction, March 1.—Oliver David Shunk, eldest son of Nathaniel Shunk, sr., West Annette-street, died at Grace Hospital last night, aged 21 years. Services will be held at the residence, corner Annette and Elizabeth streets, on Friday morning, after which the remains will be taken to Maple for interment.

Mr. and Mrs. Taylor and family of South Keele-street will leave for their ranch, 75 miles west of Regina, N.W.T., this month.

The executive committee of West York Liberal-Conservative Association have recommended the appointment of R. O. Harvey of Vaughan, J. Ashman of York and E. R. Rogers of Toronto Junction as license commissioners for the riding.

Weston, March 1.—The village has been in darkness since Sunday night owing to a break at the electric light power station.

A meeting of the high school board will be held on Thursday night.

Assessor Musson had a consultation with Reeve Bull and councilors, Ashman, Cousins, Garhouse and Middlebrook as to the value he should place on properties in Weston during the present year. For some years the assessment was based on 70 per cent. of the cash value of the property, but last year it was based upon the full cash selling value, with the result that the school tax was increased for 1904. As a result of the latter plan the rate was raised to 100 per cent. The number of children in Weston between the ages of 5 and 21 in 1903 was 251, as compared with 242 in 1902 and 1904 it was 250.
