★ day School has had an increase of scholars, for whose accommodation the School Room has been considerably enlarged and improved at an outlay of £340, a large portion of which is still due. Reward Books, to the number of 149 have been distributed to the diligent and attentive.

The many meetings held during the year, for the purpose of providing sufficient church accommodation for our people have resulted in the proposed erection of a second Church in another part of the City, which will cost about £1500, subscriptions to the required amount being already entered into.
