Care Awaits You in the New Breathing

(London Standard.)

Lord Weardale presided at the final sitting of the International Congress on Alcoholism, held on Saturday, at the Imperial Institute, South Kensington, at which legislation dealing with inebriety was foreshadowed.

Dr. R. Welsh Branthwaite, (representing the home office) maintained that interference with the liberty of the inebriate was justified, and, to carry this out, legislation, amply protected against misapplication, was needed. Any law for inebriates must be elastic enough to permit the application of the mildest possible measures, and, at the same time, of stronger powers when the milder had proved ineffectual. Our existing inebriate acts were defective in these attributes, but there was reason to expect extensive changes in the near future.

For the benefit of drunkards who had not become criminals the English committee suggested as a preliminary measure an officially witnessed pledged to abstain from alcoholic liquors. On failure to keep this pledge the inebriate might be enabled to place himself under care of a guardian or in a licensed retreat; the failure of these measures to be met by the power to enable certain friends of the inebriate to apply for a compulsory order of guardianship or committal to a retreat.

Dr. W. Crafts (U. S. A.), said he had seen more women drinking in London in one hour on Sunday than he had seen in America in forty years.
