for instruction are from 7:45 to 10 p m.

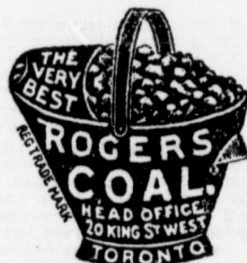
