

In the Old Burial Ground

A look over the list of inscriptions on the stones in the Old Burying Ground shows that our forefathers were not given much to unnecessary words, as most contain only the record of the birth and death dates.

One in today's list, "Margaret Amelia, wife of Town Mayor Gallagher, died Feb. 21, 1886, aged 33 years," raises the question of what town her husband was mayor, as there is no mayor of that name listed among the chief magistrates of St. John.

Today The Times-Star prints the second instalment of inscriptions on the stones still left standing in this burying place of the founders of the city, as follows:—

ROTHESAY BOYS DO GOOD WORK IN EXAMINATIONS

Complete results obtained in the recent matriculation examinations conducted by McGill University by candi-

dates from Rothersay Collegiate School have only just come to hand, as the first results sent out by the University were lost in transit. They are as follows:—

There were three candidates who took the full matriculation. Of these R. W. Ganong matriculated in science and T. P. Barnett in arts, while J. C. Armstrong is credited with nine subjects out of ten required.

The university allows candidates to write off any subject they please in the year preceding the one in which they offer themselves for full matriculation and credits them with the subjects in which they pass. There were nine candidates who took part only of the examination. Their names are appended with the credits they obtained: R. H. Allen, O. C. Bacon, C. L. Domville, W. W. Foster, F. B. Robinson, N. Skinner, A. R. Rowley each obtained credit for four subjects. R. A. Armstrong and G. G. Parker obtained credit for three subjects each.

There were 17 recommended candidates who took the Dalhousie University matriculation. Of these 16 obtained full matriculation and one candidate failed in one subject. Their names and results were previously published.
