In the Old Burial Ground

A look over the list of inscriptions on the stones in the Old Burying Ground shows that our forefathers were not given much to unnecessary words, as most contain only the record of the birth and death dates.

One in today's list, "Margaret Amelia, wife of Town Mayor Gallagher, died Feb. 21, 1838, aged 33 years," raises the question of what town her husband was mayor, as there is no mayor of that name listed among the chief magistrates of St. John.
