### MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

The case against George Cameron of Moncton, charged with bigamy was taken up in the Moncton police court yesterday. President D. B. Hanna of the C. N. R. speaking of the recent order forbidding C. N. R. employees from being candidates for political office said the order simply deals with partisan politics and has nothing to do with municipal politics. On the contrary the railway encourages its employees to take a full and keen interest in municipal politics. It has been unofficially announced that the Ford automobile plant at Highland Park, Detroit, has been closed indefinitely, throwing 50,000 men out of work. It is expected that the plant will not be reopened before Feb. 1 next. Hundreds of thousands of home-going people in New York yesterday were delayed almost an hour by an accident in the main power house of the Interborough Rapid Transit Company which virtually crippled all subway and elevated railway services.

**WILD ANIMALS TOLL GROWS.**  
London, Eng., Dec. 30.—Statistics compiled by the British government show 2,637 persons were killed by wild beasts in India in 1919, an increase of 473 over the previous year. The loss of life from snake bites during the year was 20,278 as compared with 22,000 the year previous.
