### CANADIAN RECORD FOR SWIMMING

George Vernot of the Montreal Establishes New Mark

Montreal, Aug. 12—By winning the bridge-to-bridge swim, the feature of the annual championships of the St. Rose Swimming Club, on Saturday afternoon, George Vernot, representing the Montreal Swimming Club, earned the title of long-distance outdoor swimming champion, and at the same time established a new Canadian record for the distance of a mile and a quarter.

The feat accomplished by Vernot in winning this event for the third successive year, according to swimming authorities, has never been equaled in Canadian waters. Vernot, previous to winning the bridge-to-bridge event won the 440 yards open Canadian championship, and repeated in the longer event.

The race was one of the most spectacular ever witnessed in Canadian waters. Vernot was the first to take the water when the word to start was given, and he hurried into a lead that he maintained to the finish. The races were given international importance by the entry of Leo Giebel of the New York Athletic Club, long distance outdoor champion of the United States. In both the mile and a quarter and the 440 yards race Giebel finished second to Vernot.

The races were held on the river at St. Rose, which was crowded with small craft, making it difficult for the swimmers in the long race to get through, as many of those in the canoes and boats were ahead of the competitors in their effort to get to the finish line first, and in this way the swimmers had to work their way in and out among the boats on the course. There was no interference to any of the competitors, which is shown by the record of 29 minutes and 38.2 seconds made by Vernot. The previous mark of 32 minutes and 45 seconds was also held by Vernot.

#### BACK AGAIN TO N. C. O.

Lieut. Colonels and Majors Drop Rank—Verses Show Regret

Coblenz, Aug. 1—(New York Times correspondence)—In these days when the breaking up of the American Army of Occupation brings many partings of fighting men, one hears a dignified officer say often to other dignified officers, "Well, good-bye, fellows, I'm going back home to be a sergeant." This means the speaker was one of the thousands of N. C. O.'s who gained commissions and did so well they rose to high rank.

There are lieutenant colonels and majors galore in the A. E. F. who were sergeants before the United States got into the war, and who, when they get home, lose their temporary rank.

As an instance, I mention Lieut. Col. Haverfield, adjutant of the Army of Occupation. He is a regular sergeant. Then there's Major Cockfield, the provost marshal, who made good as chief of police in Coblenz. There's Major J. Leland Bass, who was admiral of the Rhine. There are scores of others who lose the glory of the silver or gold leaf. Stating their case, Captain Madden has written a string of verse, I quote here:—

(Dedicated to the army sergeants who were made second lieutenants during the war.)

They took me out of the ranks I loved, And they gave me a golden bar, I, who had sailed the seven seas, From Maine out to Zanzibar; My education was none too good, I never wore evening dress, And of balls and teas in society, I knew nothing, I confess.

It lifted me up on a higher plane Than I'd ever known before, For I knew what a commission meant In the days before the war; I was awfully proud when they gave it to me, And I wrote a letter that night Back home to a girl I used to know, And somehow the world seemed bright.

Then came a night that was black as sin, And the blinding, cold rain fell, We were holding a line just east of the Meuse, Not far from old Cunel; The zero hour was 4 o'clock, And our chances of life were slim, But I thought of the words her letter brought, "I'm awfully proud of you, Jim."

They sent me back, and for two long months I lay in a dreamy ward; When I returned to the colors again, The Huns had sheathed the sword; For the war had ceased, and peace had come.

And now they are through with me, I'll be wearing the chevrons again, Just as I used to be.

Seditious Conspiracy Case Proceedings in Winnipeg

Appeal For Renewal of Bail—Three Others Committed for Trial on Seditious Charge—Two Men to be Deported

Winnipeg, Aug. 13—The crown yesterday completed its case in the preliminary hearing of eight labor leaders charged with seditious conspiracy—William J. Irem, W. A. Pritchard, R. B. Russell, R. J. Johns, R. E. Bray, George Armstrong, John Queen and A. A. Heaps—and the accused were committed for trial at the October sessions. Warrant of commitment was withheld pending an appeal for renewal of bail.

Winnipeg Aug. 13—James Grant, John Farnell and A. W. Martin were committed for trial in the police court today on charges of seditious conspiracy. They were alleged to have been active in planning the silent parade which precipitated the Winnipeg riots of June 21.

Oscar Schoppe, branded as an undesirable alien and ordered deported by the immigration board of inquiry, must leave Canada. The Manitoba court of appeals refused to grant an application made by counsel in his behalf that the deportation order be annulled and all proceedings quashed.

The following was given out by the acting immigration commissioner:—"At a meeting of the immigration board held on Saturday, August 9, an order was made for the deportation of Samuel Blumenburg (one of the alien labor leaders arrested during the recent strike), upon his admission that he had made statements in connection with his entry into Canada which were contrary to the facts within the provisions of the immigration act."

"Did you grasp the significance of that lecturer's remarks?"

"Then why did you applaud so much?"

"Well, I admire brains, and I thought that man must be awful smart to understand what he was talking about."

### THE EIGHT SENT UP FOR TRIAL

Seditious Conspiracy Case Proceedings in Winnipeg

Appeal For Renewal of Bail—Three Others Committed for Trial on Seditious Charge—Two Men to be Deported

Winnipeg, Aug. 13—The crown yesterday completed its case in the preliminary hearing of eight labor leaders charged with seditious conspiracy—William J. Irem, W. A. Pritchard, R. B. Russell, R. J. Johns, R. E. Bray, George Armstrong, John Queen and A. A. Heaps—and the accused were committed for trial at the October sessions. Warrant of commitment was withheld pending an appeal for renewal of bail.

Winnipeg Aug. 13—James Grant, John Farnell and A. W. Martin were committed for trial in the police court today on charges of seditious conspiracy. They were alleged to have been active in planning the silent parade which precipitated the Winnipeg riots of June 21.

Oscar Schoppe, branded as an undesirable alien and ordered deported by the immigration board of inquiry, must leave Canada. The Manitoba court of appeals refused to grant an application made by counsel in his behalf that the deportation order be annulled and all proceedings quashed.

The following was given out by the acting immigration commissioner:—"At a meeting of the immigration board held on Saturday, August 9, an order was made for the deportation of Samuel Blumenburg (one of the alien labor leaders arrested during the recent strike), upon his admission that he had made statements in connection with his entry into Canada which were contrary to the facts within the provisions of the immigration act."

"Did you grasp the significance of that lecturer's remarks?"
