There is no record of what "Mr. Smith" and Mr. Berry talked about, but both are jovial souls, with a wide knowledge of the "resources of civilization," and an exchange of confidences between them would doubtless be a delightful diversion.

Mr. Berry did not accompany "Mr. Smith" to this side of the line, and we are as much in the dark as ever as to the possible date of Mr. Berry's complance with the wishes of the royal commission, and the people of New Brunswick.
