GERMANY GETTING SUPPLIES VIA DUTCH PORTS

Canadian Commissioner to Holland Says Strict Neutrality is Being Preserved—The Army Mobilized

Ottawa, Sept. 27.—A report to the Trade and Commerce Department from J. T. Lithgow, Canadian trade commissioner in Holland, states that grain and food supplies are now passing as freely as the limited shipping facilities will permit from Rotterdam up the Rhine to Germany, the Netherlands observing strict neutrality and interfering with traffic to and from Germany only so far as reserving the right to seize any food-stuffs, military stores, raw material, etc. that may be directly required for Dutch defence.

The freedom of the Dutch ports to German imports or exports, however, says Mr. Lithgow, is practically of no consequence at the moment as practically no grain ships and few of any kind, were entering at the date of his report, namely, September 1.

At Rotterdam, he says, some 60,000 men are out of employment in consequence of the interruption of the transit trade.

The Dutch troops called out prior to September 1 totalled 240,000 men. The soldiers of the Lanston numbering about 150,000 men have also been notified and "a state of war" exists in all the districts along the frontier. The field army is on duty near the boundary and the coast is protected by a special coast guard. The whole army is on a war footing.
