**TREMENDOUS LOSSES SUSTAINED BY AUSTRINIANS**  
Venice, Nov. 8.—The Vienna Neue Presse publishes the following statement from its correspondent at the Austrian army headquarters: "Our losses are now much lessened in fixed battles and storming assaults. Attacks made between August 12 and September 11 required much greater sacrifices than has the fighting since then, the later engagements having been fought from protected positions."  
Vast numbers of wounded soldiers are now arriving in Vienna daily from the front, and if the early losses were much greater than the present, they must have been tremendous.  
May Reconcile Bulgaria and Serbia.  
The Reichspost, the Austrian military organ, betrays alarm over what it says is an attempt by Russia to bring about a reconciliation between Bulgaria and Serbia. This paper's Sofia correspondent sends a despatch saying that a political agent of the Russian Emperor recently went to Nish, Serbia, where he had long conferences with the crown prince and the president of the council.

**CLERGYMEN URGE MEN TO JOIN THE COLORS**  
**Recruits Parade to St. Paul's Church—Active Service or Home Guard Duty of Every Man—Centenary Anniversary**  
Rev. E. B. Hooper made an impressive appeal in St. Paul's yesterday morning to men and women to accede to the present need of the empire. Mr. Hooper took as his text "Who will go for us?" Then arose I, here am I, I send me." The occasion was the first church parade of the 62nd since they were enlisted for the battalion in St. John. Lieut.-Col. J. J. McAvity was in command and the regimental band was in attendance. The soldiers appeared out for the first time in khaki. Rev. F. S. Porter, in German street Baptist church last evening, said, "I deem it the duty of every able-bodied man, either to volunteer for service overseas or to accept a position in the home guard, soon to be organized in our city." Mr. Porter took as his text "Who knoweth whether thou art not come to the time as this?"  
Rev. Dr. Morrison in a recruiting sermon in Carleton Presbyterian church, made a spiritual appeal to his people and said that the present conflict was a clash of intellectual forces and reason for call of church to arms.  
Rev. J. J. McAvity, preaching to his congregation in St. Matthew's Presbyterian church last evening, pointed out that the present war had been foretold in the Apocrypha. The preacher expressed the fullest confidence in Britain's future.  
Rev. H. A. Goodwin of Moncton preached to large congregations at both services in Centenary Methodist church yesterday; the occasion being the seventy-fifth anniversary of the opening of the church for public worship. In the evening solos were sung by Mrs. A. P. Crockett and C. W. Skelton.

**GURKAS ATTACKED LIKE JUNGLE TIGERS**  
Copenhagen, Nov. 8.—The Berlin Lokal Anzeiger pays tribute to the gallantry of the Indian troops in standing against the heavy firing of the German artillery. "One can understand the courage and fighting ability of the Indian Gurkhas," it says, "but we must despise their methods of fighting. Their sudden onslaught on the German soldiers was a lively reminder of the fighting methods of the tiger in the Indian jungle."
