## ANDOVER MAN JOINS U. S. MEDICAL CORPS

Dexter, Me., Feb. 7.—Dr. Joseph H. Murphy of this town, captain in the United States Medical Reserve Corps, leaves Wednesday morning for Boston, where he will report to Major Arthur E. Austin of the northeastern department for service at Fort Dupont, Del. The fort is one of the coast defense forts and is garrisoned by coast artillery at the present time.

Captain Murphy, who is one of Dexter's leading physicians and surgeons, was born in Andover, N. B., in 1896 and received his early education in the provincial schools, after which he served six years in the drug business before entering Bowdoin Medical School, from which he was graduated in 1911.
