EVIDENCE TAKEN IN THE CLARK CASE

Henry Gallagher and R. B. Kessen On The Witness Stand Today

Mention of Transactions Which Brought About the Trouble—G. W. Fowler, Clark's Counsel, Gives Hint of Defence—Clark's Letter to The Bank Manager

The trial of Harry B. Clark, former manager of the Charlotte street branch of the Bank of New Brunswick, which opened this morning in the Circuit Court before Mr. Justice Barry, was marked by the introduction of an interesting defence.
