SOME BRIDGE MATTERS

Work Done and Accounts Submitted, But Held Out of Records for Year to Make Good Showing—Last Hour Action on Legislation

Fredericton, April 11—In the public accounts committee this morning three facts were brought out—that on the Sherbrooke Mill Pond bridge in Kent county, the work was done during August, September and October, 1909. The accounts were sworn to on October 20, 1909, but payment was not received until November 3, 1909.
