

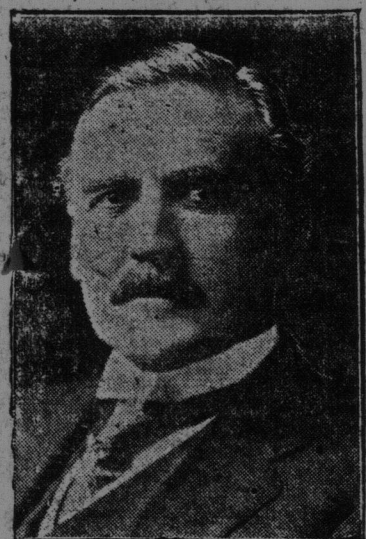

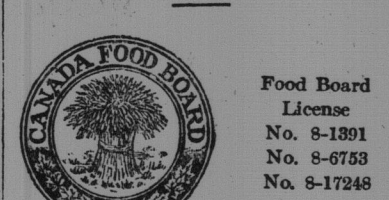

Ottawa, Nov. 15.—Canadian farmers and livestock breeders are warned to avoid sacrificing good breeding stock during any temporary market disturbances consequent upon the restoration of peace. In a statement issued by the Livestock Branch of the Department of Agriculture tonight it is pointed out that although the receipts at the Canadian livestock market and also those of the United States during the last week have been exceptionally heavy, the prices of the better classes of cattle and hogs remain firm at last week's quotations.
