2. Little River Section and Station, Codroy, Bay St. George, to be re-named ST. ANDREW'S.

3. Salvage Bay, District of Bonavista, to be re-named EAST PORT.

4. Little Beaver Cove, District of Fogo, to be re-named PORT ALBERT.

5. Samson, Bonavista Bay, to revert to its original name of FLAT ISLAND.

Rates of Commission on Money Orders

The rates of commission on Money Orders issued by any Money Order Office in Newfoundland to the United States of America, the Dominion of Canada and any part of Newfoundland, are as follows:

For sums not exceeding \$10	5 cts
Over \$10 but not exceeding \$20	10 cts
Over \$20 but not exceeding \$30	15 cts
Over \$30 but not exceeding \$40	20 cts
Over \$40 but not exceeding \$50	25 cts
Over \$50 but not exceeding \$60	30 cts
Over \$60 but not exceeding \$70	35 cts
Over \$70 but not exceeding \$80	40 cts
Over \$80 but not exceeding \$90	45 cts
Over \$90 but not exceeding \$100	50 cts

Maximum amount of a single Order to any of the above countries and offices in Newfoundland, \$100, but as many may be obtained as the remitter requires.

Position—On the North Point of the entrance to Cupids Cove.

Description—An occulting White Light.

Periods—Light 4 seconds, Eclipse 4 seconds, Light 4 seconds, Eclipse 4 seconds.

Elevation—Height of Light from high water to focal plane 37 1/4 ft. Height of Tower from base to top of lantern 17 1/2 ft.

Structures—The Station comprises a round iron light tower, and a small store connected to tower by covered passage way.

Color—White.

Remarks—This light will be in operation during open navigation of each year.

Nfld. Seaman Killed At North Sydney

North Sydney, Sept. 29.—A distressing accident occurred on Commercial Street last night about midnight, whereby a seaman named Charles Stroud, mate of the schooner Bessie C. Lake, of Rose Blanche, lost his life by being struck by an automobile.

It appears that the unfortunate man Stroud, in company with a Captain Street, had been set upon by a gang of toughs and chased down King Street. They beat Captain Street pretty badly and, it is reported, took fifteen dollars off him before he made his escape. Stroud, who got away from them, ran down King Street. In his hurry and fright he ran right into an automobile, owned and driven by Mr. Colin McKenzie, of Sydney, who was proceeding homewards with a party of friends and driving along very slowly when the accident occurred.

Stopped His Car

Mr. McKenzie at once stopped his car and saw that the man was quite badly injured. Police Officer Gilbert happened along just at this time and summoned Dr. M. T. McLean, who had Stroud removed to the hospital in Mr. McKenzie's car. Everything possible was done for the poor fellow, but he never regained consciousness and passed away at three o'clock. It is said that the only mark to be seen is a bruise on the forehead. The body is now at Dooley's undertaking parlors, and an inquest will be held in the court house this morning at 10 o'clock, before Coroner A. R. Forbes.

Suspect Arrested

This morning a fellow named D. Burke, who is supposed to be one of the gang who chased the victim and his companion, was arrested and placed in jail. Three warrants have already been issued for other supposed members of the gang and their arrest will likely follow through the day.

Car Owner Not Blamed

No blame whatever is attached to Colin McKenzie for this unfortunate accident, who said that he possibly could for the poor seaman after the sad occurrence. Stroud was about 25 years of age, unmarried, and a native of Rose Blanche, Newfoundland.

Mr. McKenzie, when seen by the Record this morning, said that he regretted the accident very deeply, and that his regret was shared by his friends in the car.

PROCLAMATION

GEORGE the FIFTH, by the Grace of GOD, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas, King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

WHEREAS We deem it expedient and necessary, to appoint Terms or Sessions for the holding of our Supreme Court for the Northern District of our said Island of Newfoundland, at the several times and places hereinafter mentioned:

We do, therefore, declare to all our loving subjects in our said Island that it is Our will and pleasure to direct and appoint that Our Supreme Court on Circuit for the Northern District of our said Island, shall be open and hold—

At Brigus, on Friday, the Seventeenth, and Saturday, the Eighteenth days of November next;

At Harbor Grace, on Monday, the Twentieth, Tuesday, the Twenty-first, Wednesday, the Twenty-second, and Thursday, the Twenty-third days of November next;

At Carbonere, on Friday, the Twenty-fourth, and Saturday, the Twenty-fifth days of November next.

And the said Court shall be kept open for the periods hereinbefore prescribed at each of the respective places as aforesaid, provided the presiding Judge shall have business to do there; and, if necessary, such Judge may extend the term at any of the said places for a period not exceeding two days, and until the determination of the trial of any case then proceeding.

And We do, by these presents, further order and direct that in the event of a Judge who may preside in the said Court in the Northern District of our said Island being prevented by illness, or other circumstances from opening our said Court on any of the days hereinbefore appointed, or if the said Judge should arrive at any of the places hereinbefore named for holding our said Court before the time stated for the opening thereof, and shall deem it proper to open the same without delay, the said Judge may, and he is hereby authorized to open and hold our said Court on any other day or days than those hereinbefore specified, and to keep the same open for the respective periods hereinbefore stated, as aforesaid, if he should find it necessary for the despatch of business to do so.

And of these Presents all Magistrates, the Sheriff, Officers of the Constabulary Force, and all Bailiffs, Constables, Keepers of Gaols, and all other officers in the execution of their offices about the premises, and all singular other persons whom these Presents do, shall or may concern, are hereby required to take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Witness Our trusty and well-beloved Sir WALTER EDWARD DAVIDSON, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over our said Island of Newfoundland and its Dependencies, at St. John's, in our said Island, this 31st day of July, A. D. 1916, and the Seventh year of Our Reign.
