Dear Mr. Scott:-

I am enclosing herewith a report on the various schools in the Onion Lake Agency which were inspected by Mr. Murison.

I would draw your attention to what the Inspector says regarding the St. Lawrence Day School on the Cold Lake Reserve. I concur in his remarks.

The work at the other schools appears to be carried on in a satisfactory manner.

You will note the Inspector's remarks regarding the 20 h.p. Fairbanks-Morse engine, with force pump, at the R.C. Residential School, namely that it is of no use without a belt tightener. This should have been provided by the school authorities themselves. We cannot attempt to look after the hundred and one details in connection with these schools, unless we make up our minds that we are to manage them entirely and be responsible for everything.
