HEIRS MUST BE BRITISH

Will of Wm. Patton, Former Dentist of Ex-Kaiser
Wm. Robert Patton, formerly attending dentist to the ex-emperor of Germany, who died in London, England, left an estate valued at \$100,000. The executors are the Toronto General Trusts Corporation, Thomas W. Carlyle, bank manager, Cobalt, and Annie Louise Carlyle, spinster, of Toronto.

The estate consists principally of bank and mining stocks in Canada, and is inventoried as follows: Household goods, \$5,500; book debts \$9,933; mortgages, \$5,105; stocks \$68,124; cash in bank, \$937; motor boat, \$7,750. The estate is subject to a lease held on his former summer home at Lake Shore road, valued at \$7,750.

Decedent's niece and adopted daughter, Annie Louise Carlyle, inherits the bulk of the estate and the will states that no distribution shall take place during the life, or to any beneficiary who is an enemy subject to, or on behalf of any person resident in an enemy country without the express sanction of the Crown.

The testator further provides that the proceeds of his estate shall be invested in securities from the time of which provision is made in his son and grandson, who must retain British citizenship and be of the Lutheran religion. After the death of the survivors, the estate is to be divided into five equal shares and apportioned among their relatives.

The New York American League Baseball Club announced the purchase of Pitcher Robert McGraw from the Boston Americans for the waiver price. McGraw was sent by the Yankees to the Red Sox last August in the deal which brought Pitcher Carl Mays to New York.

Ostend's Picturesque Celebration

One of the most picturesque ceremonies which have come down from the ages is the blessing of the sea, which takes place in Ostend on the first Sunday in July every year. Early on the day a procession forms outside the church of St. Peter and St. Paul, and walks slowly to the Digue de Mer, where a temporary altar is previously erected. A young girl in a white shepherdess dress, and carrying an effigy of the peschal lamb, generally leads the way, and behind her, on the shoulders of four fishermen dressed as brides, the figures of the Virgin Mary, with the infant Jesus, is born aloft. Behind the women come several boys attired as fishermen and carrying charts, anchors, fishing nets, and baskets. The procession is completed by boys supporting a large model of a ship.
