ly and gently intreated, vntill of late some of Our Subjects of the Realme of England, planting themfelues in that Countrey, and there residing and inhabiting, vpon conceit, that for wrongs or iniuries done there, either on the Shoare, or in the Sea adioyning, they cannot be here impeached, and the rather, for that We, or Our Progenitors, haue not hitherto giuen Lawes to the Inhabitants there, and by that example, Our Subiects reforting thither, iniure one another, and vse all manner of excesse to the great hinderance of the
