Application has been made to your Committee for the return to the Petitioner of certain documents filed as Exhibits on her behalf at the inquiry into the Bill, passed at the Session of Parliament held in 1895, intituled: "An Act for the Relief of Helen Woodburn Jarvis."

As copies of the said Exhibits have been printed and are of record, your Committee recommend that authority be given to the Clerk of the Senate, to return to F. C. Chrysler, Esq., Q.C., Counsel for the Petitioner for the said Bill, the original documents filed as Exhibits, Numbers Ten and Eleven, viz:—
