THE PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION AND HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT ACT

PUBLIC NOTICE

IS HEREBY GIVEN that pursuant to sections 5 and 33 of The Public Transportation and Highway Improvement Act (R.S.O. 1970, c. 201) the Lieutenant Governor in Council did designate the proposed highway known as Highway 410 (Brampton Expressway), as the King's Highway and as a controlled-access highway. The effective date of the designation as a controlled-access highway was the 19th day of November, 1972.

The proposed highway having a right-of-way of approximately 350 to 600 feet is located in:

1. The Town of Mississauga, (formerly Township of Toronto), in the county of Peel.
- The E 1/2 of lots 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 and 15, concession 2, east of Hurontario Street;
- The E 1/2 of Lot 15, concession 3, east of Hurontario Street;
- The W 1/2 of Lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13, concession 2, east of Hurontario Street;
- The W 1/2 of Lots 14 and 15, concession 3, east of Hurontario Street;

as shown hereunder.



Ministry of Transportation and Communications plan P-5098-1 illustrating the King's Highway and controlled-access highway designations, was filed with the Superintendent of Record Services of the Ministry of Transportation and Communications at Downsview on August 21, 1972.

Ontario Regulations 549/72 designating the proposed highway as a controlled-access highway was published in the Ontario Gazette dated December 2, 1972.

The King's Highway and controlled-access highway designations do not expropriate land but after the effective date the provisions of Section 35 of The Public Transportation and Highway Improvement Act in respect to signs, buildings and entrance permits apply.

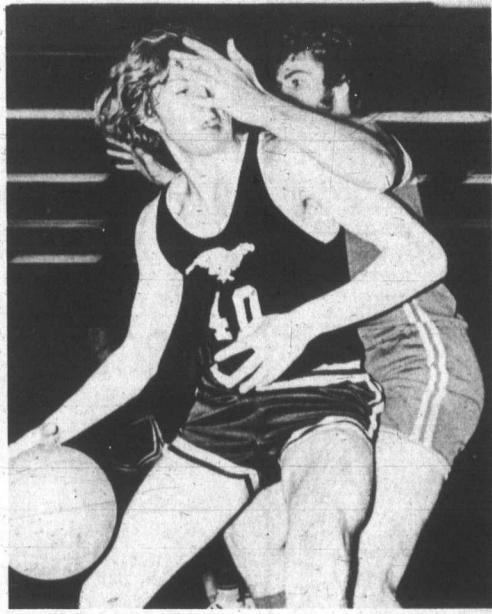
