OBSERVERS INTERPRETED THIS TO MEAN THE NEWSPAPER UNDERSTOOD THE
KING WAS STILL DETERMINED TO MARRY THE WOMAN OF HIS CHOICE,
THAT HE FELT HE CGULD NOT FORM A GOVERNMENT TO FIGHT FOR BOTH
THRONE AND WIFE, AND THAT, THEREFORE, HE WOULD ABDICATE
RATHER THAN CREATE A CRISIS EVEN GREATER THAN THE PRESENT
ONE.
