

That the number of children is such as to
 render his constant presence at the
 Institution of much greater advantage
 to the interests of the Department than
 anything likely to accrue from making
 visits of the nature referred to, unless
 perhaps, under very exceptional circum-
 stances, when, if necessary, extra trans-
 port could be hired. I have to inform
 you that your view of the matter appears
 to be the more reasonable one; and
 the Department thinks that the various
 Agents should now be able to keep up
 the number of pupils at the Institution.
