

neglecting to insist on a change of
foot gear, or of the pupil running
out and getting the dry pair wet.

The question of expense is one
which, of course, merits consideration.
The average attendance of pupils at
day schools in the Edmonton District
is about forty-two, and one pair of
shoes to each, at the usual contract
price, would entail an immediate
cost of about Sixty-three Dollars (\$63.00);
if however the supply were extended to
the number of pupils on the rolls of the
day and boarding schools generally
in the Territories numbering about
Eight hundred. The cost would be
about Twelve hundred Dollars (\$1200.00)
per annum.
