Sept. 2 George Blenkinsop to I.W. Powell - Census of Indian tribes inhabiting Barclay Sound. Indians wish to be secured in the possession of land to be allotted them.

1876
March 17 John Douglas to Superintendent of Indian Affairs - Complains of Indian interference with the occupation of his land.

April 11 John A. Webster & Company to James Lenihan, Indian Superintendent, New Westminster - Tender for supplies.

April 24 Deputy Minister of the Interior to James Lenihan - Father Grandidier's letter on the settlement of the Indian land question will receive prompt attention.

May 4 Deputy Minister to James Lenihan - Authorization to purchase flag for New Westminster Office.

July 13 Deputy Minister to James Lenihan - Arrangements for visiting the Sechett Indians.

Aug. 17 Governor General's Secretary to James Lenihan - Lenihan to come to Government House at Victoria immediately.

Sept. 12 G.M. Sproat to James Lenihan - Announcing his appointment by the governments of British Columbia and Canada to act in the settlement of the Indian Reserve question.

Sept. 12 Charles Good, Deputy Provincial Secretary to H. Moffatt, Secretary Indian Reserve Commission - Views of Indian Reserve Commissioners on financial matters.

Sept. 13 H. Moffatt to F.G. Vernon - Pastoral leases.

Sept. 15 E.G. Lyttleton to H. Moffatt - Interview of Indian Land Commissioners with Lord Dufferin.

Oct. 2 E.G. Lyttleton to H. Moffatt - Petition received by the Governor General.
