- 104 **Death of General Washington.** The *Ulster County Gazette*, published (on thin paper) at Kingston, Ulster County, New York, on the 4th of January, 1800, and containing an account of the death of General George Washington, on the 14th of December previously. The announcement was made to the House of Representatives by General Marshall. Both Houses addressed President John Adams on the subject, to which he made replies. The paper also contains a detailed account of the Burial of Washington, at Mount Vernon, on the 18th of December, 1799; and the paper contains various other items, as well as the reply of President Adams to the Addresses of Congress on its being convened. The paper is in very deep mourning, the black lines between the columns being a quarter of an inch broad. "No. 88, Vol. II." Price \$45.00. 1800
