It is the location of famous saline, white sulphur and hydrogen gas springs, and a popular summer resort, having extensive and superior hotel accommodation and many attractive features, besides the waters, which are specially efficacious in rheumatic, dyspeptic and blood affections. Settled in 1830. It has Methodist and Catholic churches and public school, and ships live

stock, grain and mineral waters. Access from Montreal and Ottawa by CPR to Calumet, and ORN Co's boats to L'Orignal. Regular ferry and stages meet trains and boats. Population, 150. Telegraph, GNW. Mail daily. K Arnoldi, postmaster.
