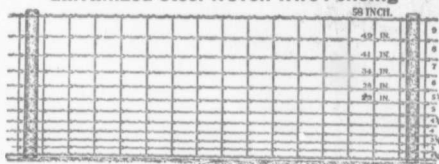

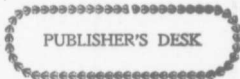

### Contracts for Ideal Fencing

A number of large contracts for railway fencing have been closed lately.
