e 200 cases) at up to 15s 6d c.i.f. for 11½ per cent. on the spot sellers are now bolding off the market, sales being retail only. Stocks of soft shipping at a primary sources are in very small compass; on the spot values are from 18s to 20s and malatia 17s. A steady business is being done in Persian foxport at unchanged prices.

Cod liver oil is firmer, there are still sellers at \$17 per barrel. In some quarters, however, the price has been advanced to \$19 per barrel, with very fair sales noted at that figure for shipment to the interior. The usual week-ly statistics regarding fishing results were not received. Mail advices from Abergen, Norway, dated May 20, say that fishing at Finmarken continues very poor on account of frequent storms which have interfered with operations. Seals are also reported to be present there. Manufacturers are slow in ordering and most of them are working on short time. They are not buying more than they absolutely have to and in consequence, trade is of a hand-to-mouth nature. The demand cannot be styled otherwise than moderate, and the tone of the market is quiet. In the local paint trade, however, business has been very good with both jobbers and retailers and with the reent fine weather, it is thought that this demand will continue for some time.
