To Our much beloved and faithful Legislative Councillors of our Province of Lower Canada and to our faithful and well beloved the Knights, Citizens and Burgesses of our faid Province, Greeting: Whereas the meeting of the

Provincial Parliament stands prorogued to the twentieth day of December inst. Nevertheless for certain causes and considerations. We have thought fit further to prorogue the fame to the twentieth day of February next, so that you nor any of you on the said twentieth day of December at our City of Quebec to appear are to be held or constrained, for We do will that you and each of you be as to Us in this matter entirely exonerated, Commanding and by the tenor of these presents firmly enjoining You and every of you and all others in this behalf interested. that on the faid twentieth day of February next, at Our City of Quebec personnally You be and appear for the dispatch of business, to treat, do. Act and conclude upon those things which in Our faid Provincial Parliament by the Common Council of Our faid Province by the favour of God may be Ordained. IN TESTIMONY whereof these Our Letters we have caused to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Our said Province to be thereunto affixed. Witness our Trusty and well beloved Robert Prescott, Esquire, Captain General and Governor in Chief of Our Provinces of Upper and Lower Canada, Nova Scotia and New Brunswick and their Dependancies, Vice Admiral of the same, General and Commander in Chief of all our Forces in the faid Provinces and in the Island of Newfoundland, at the Castle of Saint Lewis in our City of Quebec in Our faid Province of Lower Canada the fourth day of December in the year of Our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety seven and of our Reign the thirty eighth.
