

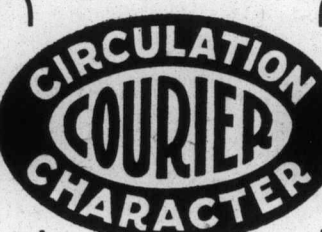

RECORD SHEEP SALE AT BURFORD

Excellent Prices Brought by Stock Disposed of by Mr. J. Lloyd Jones

The most successful sheep sale in the history of the Dominion of Canada took place last week at the home of Mr. Lloyd Jones, Burford, when a total of nearly \$5,000 was paid for sheep, and \$4,000 for other stock. The top price of the sale was paid for a Shropshire ram, which fell to a bid of \$158, made by Mr. J. G. Hamner, of Ames Agricultural College, Iowa, whose total purchases reached almost \$100. The price paid by Mr. Hamner was next to the highest ever asked in Canada in the past twenty years. Other buyers were from Wisconsin, Boston, Calgary, Bronte, Hudson Heights, Quebec, and other more adjacent points.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS
The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent, also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead tent on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$5.00 per acre.

Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.
